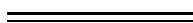

Mr Albanese (Leader of the House), pursuant to notice, moved—That standing order 31 (automatic adjournment of the House) be suspended for the sitting on Thursday 14 May 2009 and at that sitting, after the Leader of the Opposition completes his reply to the Budget speech, the House automatically stand adjourned until 12 noon on Monday, 25 May 2009, unless the Speaker or, in the event of the Speaker being unavailable, the Deputy Speaker, fixes an alternative day or hour of meeting.

5 SAFE WORK AUSTRALIA BILL 2008 [NO. 2]

Ms Gillard (Minister for Employment and Workplace Relations), pursuant to notice, presented a Bill for an Act to establish Safe Work Australia, and for related purposes.

Bill read a first time.

Ms Gillard moved—That the bill be now read a second time.

6 NATION BUILDING PROGRAM (NATIONAL LAND TRANSPORT) AMENDMENT BILL 2009

17 DEATH OF CORPORAL MATHEW RICKY ANDREW HOPKINS—CONDOLENCE MOTION—MOTION TO TAKE NOTE OF DOCUMENT—REPORT FROM MAIN COMMITTEE

The Deputy Speaker reported that the motion to take note of the copy of the condolence motion moved by the Prime Minister in relation to the death of Corporal Mathew Ricky Andrew Hopkins, had been debated in the Main Committee and returned to the House, and presented a certified copy of the document.

All Members present having risen, in silence—

Question—passed.

18 DEATH OF SERGEANT BRETT TILL—CONDOLENCE MOTION—REPORT FROM MAIN COMMITTEE

The Deputy Speaker reported that the order of the day relating to the Prime Minister's motion of condolence in connection with the death of Sergeant Brett Till had been debated in the Main Committee and returned to the House, and presented a certified copy of the motion.

All Members present having risen, in silence—

Question—passed.

19 TAX LAWS AMENDMENT (SMALL BUSINESS AND GENERAL BUSINESS TAX BREAK) BILL 2009

The order of the day having been read for the resumption of the debate on the question—That the bill be now read a second time—

Debate resumed.

Question—put and passed—bill read a second time.

Consideration in detail

Bill, by leave, taken as a whole.

Document

Mr Bowen (Assistant Treasurer) presented a supplementary explanatory memorandum to the bill.

On the motion of Mr Bowen, by leave, Government amendments (1) to (4) were made together.

Bill, as amended, agreed to.

Consideration in detail concluded.

On the motion of Mr Bowen, by leave, the bill was read a third time.

20 NATIONAL HEALTH AMENDMENT (PHARMACEUTICAL AND OTHER BENEFITS—COST RECOVERY) BILL 2008 [NO. 2]

The order of the day having been read for the resumption of the debate on the question—That the bill be now read a second time—

Debate resumed by Mr Dutton who moved, as an amendment—That all words after “That” be omitted with a view to substituting the following words: “whilst not declining to give the bill a second reading, the House:

(1) acknowledges that the bill does not require:

- (a) an independent review after two years of the cost recovery arrangements for listing medicines on the Pharmaceutical Benefits Scheme;
- (b) any such review to identify any negative impacts that the cost recovery arrangements have had on access to medicines;
- (c) any such review to be tabled in Parliament; and
- (d) an annual quality assurance audit of the evaluation of submissions (from the Pharmaceutical Benefits Advisory Committee) conducted by the relevant Department and its evaluators; and

(2) calls on the Government to make such amendments to the bill as would rectify these flaws”.

Debate continued.

Amendment negatived.

Question—That the bill be now read a second time—put and passed—bill read a second time.
